POLICY AND PROCEDURE DIRECTIVE

TITLE: Barrier Island Re-entry

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PURPOSE

The purpose of this directive is to establish a short-term and long-term standard utilized by the City in order to allow re-entry to our barrier island. Police officers will be posted at the west end of the North Causeway and South Causeway bridges.

DISCUSSION

Department personnel assigned to the barrier island re-entry post must keep in mind that residences, condominiums and other structures can be owned by citizens having non-New Smyrna Beach addresses. These citizens will be allowed barrier island entry, with proper ID and proof that they own property on the Island.

POLICY

The New Smyrna Beach Police Department is committed to efficient and courteous service to the public while protecting their safety and property. Property owners will only be prohibited from entering the barrier island when it is unsafe for them to do so.

DEFINITIONS

BARRIER ISLAND: Property that is east of the North Causeway and South Causeway bridges, which span from the most northern part of beachside to the most southern part of beachside.

PROCEDURE

6-12.01 Once the City Manager or designee has approved short-term or long-term re-entry, officers or police personnel will facilitate the re-entry in the following manner:

- Citizens will produce their driver's license or picture identification.
- The officer will then conduct a tag/DL check on their MDC on each vehicle/person that enters. This will automatically make an electronic log in Tiburon of each vehicle/person that enters.

6-12.02 Short-term entry will allow a reasonable time for citizens to assess property damages. Terms of the short-term entry shall be set forth by the City Manager or designee.

6-12.03 Long-term entry means citizens can return to their property for an indefinite period of time. Terms of the long-term entry shall be set forth by the City Manager or designee.
